

Town of Encampment
Special Meeting
October 1, 2020
7:00 p.m.

The Town of Encampment met in special session at the Encampment Town Hall on Thursday October 1, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Greg Salisbury presiding. Council members present were Shannon Fagan-Craig, and Kimberly Loftice. Town personnel present were Doreen Harvey, Clerk/Treasurer and Kevin Shue, Police Chief, Audience members were Ron Harvey and Dana Davis from the Saratoga Sun.

The meeting was called to order by reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

AGENDA

Police Vehicle Bids: Clerk/Treasurer Harvey noted that there were four bids received. Ken Gaff Chrysler, Jeep, Dodge, Ram for three 2021 Ram Crew vehicles with various packages in the amounts of \$30,943.00; \$40,608.00; \$40,752.00; Dallin Motors 2021 Dodge SSV Crew \$28,983.00; Fremont Chevrolet Buick, GMC for a 2021 Silverado 1500 SSV \$31,130.00 and one from Fremont Motors in Lander for a 2021 Ford for \$37,730.92.

Council members discussed the bid options with Mayor Salisbury noting that the town has had electrical issues with the Dodge vehicles in the past. The council ruled out the Ford due to its cost. Fagan-Craig noted that she had considered Dodge #3 due to the lighting upgrade, but that either the Dodges or the Chevy would work. Chief Shue noted that in qualifying the bids he noted that the company for the lighting upfits on the Dodges had no verifiable business information prior to July of this year and was not a part of the dealership. It was also in Utah. Clerk/Treasurer Harvey noted that the 5% bid preference had not been applied to the bid amounts stated.

Chief Shue advised that the Chevy specifications include a boosted electrical output which was a selling point to him. Vehicles in the past have not had high enough output and have had electrical issues. More output is necessary for extended light and camera use. Consensus was reached that bid for the 2021 Chevy Silverado was the lowest responsible bid.


Chief Shue asked to council to consider allowing him to add \$1,585.00 in options to the Chevy if it were selected, including heavy duty shocks, a power seat and tinted back windows for prisoner privacy.

Fagan-Craig moved to accept the bid from Fremont Chevrolet for the 2021 Silverado in the amount of \$30,130.00 plus the options requested for a total of \$32,715.00, Loftice seconded and the motion was passed.

With no further business, Loftice moved to adjourn at 7:10 p.m., Stull seconded and the motion was passed.


